EIGHT DIE IN AIRLINER FIRE

Eight passengers aboard a Ruritanian flight to Moscow died in a fire aboard an aircraft as it taxied towards a take-off runway in Beijing. The pilot quickly aborted the flight and the cabin crew operated emergency escape chutes. Fire engines and ambulances raced to the stricken aircraft.

All the crew except one stewardess were saved, as were 196 of the passengers. An airline spokesman said an investigation has already begun into the cause of the fire.
